

A FEW THINGS TO KEEP IN MIND

TRAILS ARE FOR USE BY SWEETWATER RESIDENTS AND ACCOMPANIED GUESTS ONLY
 NO UNACCOMPANIED CHILDREN UNDER AGE 12 • TRAILS ARE OPEN FROM DAWN TO DUSK
 NO MOTORIZED VEHICLES EXCEPT FOR ADA EQUIPMENT • BIKES YIELD TO PEDESTRIANS
 NO LITTERING—IF YOU BRING IT IN, TAKE IT OUT • CLEAN UP AFTER PETS
 DOGS MUST BE ON 6' LEASH AND UNDER OWNER'S CONTROL AT ALL TIMES • DO NOT FEED THE WILDLIFE
 TRAILS ARE SUBJECT TO FLOODING—DO NOT CROSS FAST MOVING STREAMS • NO FIREARMS OR HUNTING
 NO FIRES, ALCOHOL, SMOKING, OR CAMPING • DON'T CUT, REMOVE, OR DISTURB NATURAL LANDSCAPE
 USE OF THE TRAILS IS AT YOUR OWN RISK • CALL 911 FOR EMERGENCIES

PLANTS



Bluebonnet
(Lupinus texensis)
Blooms March - May



Indian Paintbrush
(Castilleja indivisa)
Blooms March - May



Winecup
(Callirhoe involucrata)
Blooms March - May



Pink Evening Primrose
(Oenothera speciosa)
Blooms March - July



Indian Blanket
(Gaillardia pulchella)
Blooms April - June



Plains Coreopsis
(Coreopsis tinctoria)
Blooms April - June



Bee Balm
(Monarda citriodora)
Blooms May - July



Madrone Tree
(Arbutus xalapensis)
Scattered throughout Sweetwater, the oldest of this relict species (approx. 800 years old) resides at the trailhead on Pedernales Summit Pkwy, after the bridge before Creekside.

WILDLIFE



White Tailed Deer
(Odocoileus virginianus)
The most popular large game animal in the U.S.



Red-Tailed Hawk
(Buteo jamaicensis)
The most common hawk in North America, usually seen soaring in wide circles high over a field.



Raccoon
(Procyon lotor)
A bandit-faced, nocturnal mammal that will eat just about anything.



Armadillo
(Dasypus novemcinctus)
These barrel-shaped animals are the official state small mammal of Texas.



Mexican Free-Tailed Bat
(Tadarida brasiliensis)
Visitors flock to downtown Austin to catch a glimpse of 1.5 million of these little creatures that reside under the Congress Ave. Bridge.



Jack Rabbit
(Lepus californicus)
Most active at night, the jack rabbit can run speeds up to 30 MPH and jump about 20 feet.



Hummingbird
(Colibri thalassinus)
Can hover in mid-air at a wing-flapping rate of around 50 times per second.
